Safety Inspections

One important aspect is the maintenance and inspection of the equipment that we use.

Be it Portable Appliance Testing on all electrical items to before use checks on tools and of course the mandatory six monthly Thorough Examination checks on our lifting equipment.

Recording these mandatory inspections are very important so make sure all your equipment is registered on the Special Tool Examination Planner and in date. Failure of these items could have catastrophic consequences to make sure they are in excellent, safe condition and within inspection dates.

Near Misses



Near Misses are an important aspect of accident prevention. Reporting a near miss can ultimately avert an accident of far worse consequences from happening. Our new near miss reporting procedure, be it app or direct from the QHSE Sharepoint, allows a quick and easy way of reporting near misses. Remember to report all of these as you may ultimately save someones life! What can be a better reason than that.

Environment

Climate change is a real and undeniable threat to our future generations. Last year at CoP26 evidence was reviewed and the decision to change the decarbonisation target of 2 degrees increase to 1.5 degrees was made. To achieve this will take a massive effort by everyone, governments, organisations, businesses and on an individual basis.

To ensure we achieve the ambitious targets set TMHE joined the UN race to zero and signed up to the Science Based Target initiative. To help map, target and reduce our carbon footprint a taskforce of 20 functional sustainability champions has been formed, working alongside a further 30 regional sustainability champions to ensure we meet the challenges ahead.

Here at TMHUK we always pride ourselves on being at the forefront of sustainability within TMHE, with 4 ISO accreditations and Platinum rating in Eco Vadis as well as being a full participant with the United Nations Global Compact.
